

# Dry Pollen Feeder

## Assembly / Mounting Instructions

Dry Pollen Feeder Tube should be placed 20-50 yards from your hive(s), NEVER feed bees at the exterior to prevent robbing. Only install enough pollen that the bees can collect in a 24-48 hour period. The feeding tube is shipped with loose cap and entrance for easy filling. Mounting hardware is also shipped loose so you are not limited in your mounting options.

## Mounting Instructions



### Chain Mounting

Using the supplied Jack Chain (2 pc. @ 12") and self-tapping screws (2). Use a Phillips screwdriver to fasten the jack chain to the tube. Make sure that the two screws are located approx. 8" apart and directly across from each other. If the screws are not in line, the feeder tube may hang crooked. Loop the jack chain over any sturdy horizontal mounting location and secure the jack chain with the supplied "S" hooks. Insure that the opening is hanging in a slight downward direction and opposite the prevailing winds.



### Plastic Ties

Use Plastic Ties to mount the Dry Pollen Tube to any stationary object such as a fence, post, deck railing, or any other location that does not allow for the feeder to hang. Ties can be either crossed or used parallel with each other. NOTE: Plastic ties are a one time use and must be cut to be removed. Replace ties can be purchased at your local Lowe's, Home Depot, Menards, or other similar store.



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
